Mission Statement:

AMOS supports the conservation and ecologically sustainable development and use of natural resources, for the benefit of current and future generations, through the promotion of sustainable and ethical hunting. The protection and the conservation of a species-rich and healthy wild fauna, and securing their livelihoods while respecting the local customs, traditions and culture; (b) promotion of environmental, natural and animal welfare and the maintenance and improvement of the existing natural Habitat's.

AMOS Aims & Objectives:

To promote regulate and enforce professionalism in the Safari hunting industry, promote the benefits of ethical hunting to the conservation and sustainable utilization of wildlife and educate the general public on the contribution hunting makes to conservation sustainable social economic development and the financial contribution to the state fiscal system.

- To promote and safeguard the hunting profession in Mozambique.*
- To promote and participate in the conservation of Mozambique's natural resources.*
- To promote and facilitate sustainable hunting as a conservation tool.*
- To promote and facilitate the empowerment of all Mozambicans wishing to participate in the hunting profession, conservation and related activities;*
- To engage with the national and provincial Governments of the Republic of Mozambique and other countries, in all matters affecting hunting, conservation and related activities.*
- To collaborate with and assist, wherever possible and to the extent reasonably feasible, all officers of organisations and authorities tasked with the conservation of natural resources.*

- *To co-operate with other persons and organisations in Africa and elsewhere having objects similar to those of this Association.*
- *To promote and market Mozambique as a leading international hunting destination.*
- *To co-operate with those (wherever situated) who by business or other circumstances are connected with hunting and to provide opportunities for discussion between them and members of the Association on matters of common interest.*
- *To promote adherence to its Code of Conduct by all AMOS members and to sanction members who contravene its Code of Conduct or act contrary to these Aims and Objects or other provisions of the Constitution of the Association.*
- *to render assistance to and serve the needs of members of the Association;*
- *to render assistance to and serve the needs, wherever possible and to the extent reasonably feasible, of the clientele of AMOS members.*
- *to regulate or prohibit, as the case may be, the publication in the Republic of Mozambique or elsewhere by members of advertisements, interviews or press releases, that may be contrary to the objects of the Association; un ethical , illegal or contravene existing laws or regulations.*
- *recognition of the global environment as a common concern to all of us,*
- *respect for all forms of life in their ecosystems,*

- *conservation of nature, mainly the fauna, in the interest of the present and future generations by preventive and precautionary measures,*
- *avoidance of the loss of biological diversity, especially through the protection of endangered species,*
- *sustainable use of natural resources as an important tool for social and economic benefits and therefore as an incentive for their conservation,*
- *harvesting of game through selective taking while respecting the natural ecosystems,*
- *improvement of wildlife management and land-use,*
- *promotion of scientific research, education as well as information to the public supporting our cause,*
- *provide advice to the public authorities, national and international organizations and answer their demands.*
- *The Associations' recognises that 'culling', 'cropping', 'capture' and vermin control are a necessary part of game management as long as they are conducted with consideration and humane treatment of the wildlife involved. However, at no time can these activities be regarded in the context of Hunting.*
